## REQUIEM, K. 626 WOLFGANG AMADEUS MOZART

The full circumstances surrounding the composition of Mozart's *Requiem* have been the subject of many fictionalized accounts (the play and film *Amadeus*, for example) and much scholarly research. Little wonder: it is one of the most intriguing stories in the entire history of music, raising questions that may never be answered.

The tale of the *Requiem* begins in July 1791, when a tall, lean stranger (now known to be Franz Anton Leitgeb, steward to Count Franz Walsegg-Stuppach) comes to visit Mozart, who is already sick and weak. The stranger, masked and wearing a large gray cloak, hands Mozart an unsigned letter and warns him at the same time to make no effort to discover the sender's name. The letter is a commission for a Requiem Mass at a fee to be set by Mozart.

Mozart agrees, and a few days later the messenger returns with fifty ducats (about \$4,500. today), one half of the fee, the remainder to be paid upon completion.

The composer immediately sets to work on the *Requiem*, but with fatalistic fervor, convinced that the messenger was, in fact, the Grim Reaper. Mozart is positive that he has been asked to write a mass for his own death at the hands of an unknown murderer who has given him a slow-acting poison.

In September, he wrote to his librettist, Lorenzo Da Ponte: "My head is confused. It is only with difficulty that I can keep my thoughts collected. The image of that stranger will not part from my eyes. I always see him before me; he asks, he urges me, he impatiently demands the work from me. I continue because composing tires me less than rest. Otherwise there is nothing more at which I need tremble. I feel it, my condition tells me: my hour has struck! I shall have to die. And so I am finishing my funeral dirge. I must not leave it incomplete."

Now confined to bed, Mozart feverishly carries on. He sketches in entire sections while simultaneously writing the full score of the

opening movement. When too ill to put pen to paper, he dictates the music to his friend and pupil Franz Xaver Süssmayr (not Antonio Salieri, as in *Amadeus*) and describes how he wants the music to end.

When death comes on December 5, 1791, Mozart has fully finished only the first of the *Requiem*'s eight sections, along with vocal parts, and outline of the harmony, and a few fully scored passages for movements two through five, although he has done only eight measures of the *Lacrymosa* section.

Eager to collect the rest of the commission, Constanze, Mozart's widow, asks the young court composer Joseph von Eybler to complete the work. (Why she did not ask Süssmayr, the obvious choice, is a mystery.) Eybler, overwhelmed by the responsibility, refuses, and only then does Constanze ask Süssmayr to finish the parts Mozart has left incomplete and to supply the missing sections.

The discovery in 1962 of some sketches Mozart had prepared and given to Süssmayr raises questions about exactly how much of the music was Süssmayr's. But most everyone agrees that Süssmayr completed the *Lacrymosa* beyond the eight measures Mozart had written, composed the entire *Sanctus*, *Benedictus*, and *Agnus Dei*, orchestrated *Dies Irae* and based the concluding Communion on the music Mozart had composed for the *Kyrie*. Since Süssmayr's handwriting closely resembled his master's, Constanze had no trouble passing off the entire *Requiem* as Mozart's work.

Whether Süssmayr's additions followed suggestions and sketches that Mozart had given him, as he later insisted, or were completely original is still a matter for conjecture. Experts point to several passages that are not in the "true" Mozart style. But almost everyone agrees that the resulting work is a composition of sheer genius.

Day of wrath, day of mourning, See the prophet's warning fulfilled: heaven and earth are burning in ashes. What fear lies in men's hearts, when the Judge brings His strict judgement!

#### **TUBA MIRUM**

Tuba mirum spargens sonum. Per sepulcra regionum, Coget omnes ante thronum. Mors stupebit et natura, Cum resurget creatura, Judicanti responsura. Liber scriptus porferetur, in quo torum continetur, Unde mundus judicerur. Judex ergo cum sediebit, Quidquid latet apparebit: Nil inultum remanebit. Quid sum miser tunc dicturus? Quem patronum rogaturus, Cum vix justus sit securus?

The wondrous sound of the trumpet rings through the graves of the earth, bringing all to the throne. Death is conquered, nature quakes, and creation awakes, responding to its Judge. Just as the Word prophecied, the world will be judged. When the judge is seated and all is laid bare, nothing will remain hidden.

Recordare, Jesu pie, Qudo sum causa tuae viae: Ne me perdas illa die. Quarens me, sedisti lassus: Redmisti crucem passus: Tantus labor non sit cassus. Juste judes ultionis, Donum fac remissionis, Ante diem rationis! Ingemisco, tamquam reus: Culpa rubet vultus meus: Supplicanti parce, Deus! Qui Mariam absolvisti, Et latronem exaudisti, Mihi quoque spem dedisti. Preces meae non sunt dignae: Sed tu bonus fac benigne, Ne perenni cremer igne. Remember, dear Jesus, the giver of life, not to leave me in the day of mourning. You sought and bought me on the cross and such labor was not in vain. You forgave the sinful woman, You forgave the dying thief, and you give me hope. My prayers are worthless, yet Your grace rescues me from eternal flames. Count me among Your favored sheep, and raise me up with Your right hand.

When the wicked are confounded, doomed to violent flames, call on me with Your blessings. I kneel low with a contrite heart of ashes, seeking help through to the end. ## THE DIRECTORS

#### ROBERT ENGLE

Northwest College Master Chorale Northwest Singers

As chair of the music department, Dr. Engle has worked this year to formalize the music curriculum into degree programs with majors in music ministry and music education. He is partially responsible for the founding of a new annual collegiate choral festival for the state of Washington, held for the first time this year at Pacific Lutheran University. He actively participated in the state convention of Washington Music Educators Association in Yakima and directed a 600-voice mass choir for the Association of Christian Schools International (NW Division) music fest in March. Also in March, he traveled to Detroit to present a seminar on Samoan music for elementary school children. He will tour with the Northwest Singers to Hawaii in May and in June, will attend a national choral conducting symposium in Wildwood, New Jersey.

## WILLIAM OWEN

His Praise

William Owen teaches music full-time at Northwest College. He presently teaches in the areas of music history, church music administration, worship planning, voice class, private voice, conducting and oversees the church music interns. In addition, he directs *His Praise*, a group that tours for the college approximately twice per month. He also is presently pursuing acceptance to a doctoral program in choral conducting.

#### **BRIAN BEHRLE**

Northwest Gospel Jazz

Currently, Brian directs and is administrator of Northwest Gospel Jazz, handling all facets of programs, bookings, writing and arranging, keeping the band full and facilitating weekly rehearsals. Brian also directs the orchestra at Calvary Temple in Seattle, writing and arranging to help the worship department. Brian works full-time at a local software vendor as a group assistant, and is a 1996 graduate of Northwest College.

### THE ENSEMBLES

#### NORTHWEST COLLEGE MASTER CHORALE

The Northwest College Master Chorale represented the college this year by Christmas caroling in downtown Kirkland, by singing in a state-wide intercollegiate festival and a national convention (Society for Pentecostal Studies), and as a lead-on group and back-up singers for a concert by The Katinas. They were frequent participants in Chapel services, and in one case, lead worship for forty minutes. They also hosted a gospel concert, singing on a program with four invited church choirs from the Seattle and Tacoma area. They presented a choral masterwork each semester: the Vivaldi *Gloria* in the fall, and the Mozart *Requiem* this evening. Most importantly, they are learning to distinguish between *performance* and *worship* in the Christian life.

#### **NORTHWEST SINGERS**

Highlighting the year for the Northwest Singers has been its decision to concentrate on *a cappella* singing, and to extend their outreach to ethnic churches. They have visited Japanese, black, and Samoan churches this year, often singing in the host language of the church or practicing and singing with the host church choir as a part of their visit. They visited a UW campus ministry, sang for a Board of Directors banquet, serenaded the campus, and sang for a company Christmas party at the Four Seasons. They will tour to Hawaii in May, where they will visit a number of churches and Christian schools, and sing in a Honolulu concert with The Katinas. The state of Hawaii does not have an evangelical Christian college, and the Singers hope to *carry the call* for Northwest College on this tour.

## THE ENSEMBLES

#### HIS PRAISE

His Praise, a 19-member touring ensemble, has traveled quite extensively this past semester. They have effectively ministered in 12 churches in the Northwest District and will be touring for one week to Salt Lake City after graduation. They sing a variety of musical styles ranging including classical/ traditional, hymnarrangements and contemporary praise music.

#### NORTHWEST GOSPEL JAZZ

Over the past year, Northwest Gospel Jazz has done over twenty-six performances ranging from outdoor events at Westlake Mall to indoor Christmas events at Aldenwood Mall and the Lights of Christmas in Stanwood. The band has also performed at many local churches such as Overlake, Cedar Park, Shoreline Community, Calvary Temple and recently at Renton Assembly. Upcoming opportunities are summer concerts in the parks, and a southern California tour plus returns to many of the locations previously listed. This group will begin rehearsing on the Northwest College campus next fall and will be open to students by audition for college credit.

#### WEST SEATTLE COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA

Dr. Patricia Kim, director

Not appearing in this particular concert series, but certainly an important part of our department's offerings this year, is the West Seattle Community Orchestra. This group, which has included our students for the past year, played in our Christmas concert series and will again service the college as the orchestra for Commencement next month. We are grateful for this relationship and the opportunities it provides for our students and look forward to continuing this liaison next year.

## MUSIC AT NORTHWEST COLLEGE

The face of the music program at Northwest College is changing. In addition to new faculty, there is an expanded agenda for the performing groups, new degree programs and new courses on the way. The choral groups have had an expanded presence in the Chapel services this year and have branched out into new on- and off-campus outreaches beyond the customary church visitations.

#### THE FUTURE OF MUSIC DEGREE PROGRAMS

The department is moving in the direction of three degree programs and a music minor, beginning in the fall semester 2000:

Music Minor. The former minor in church music is now a more general 24-credit minor in music. While it still allows for work in church music, it can also be used to explore other areas of interest in the department.

Bachelor of Arts in Music. This degree will offer a general major in music with no specific concentration, for the student interested in using music as a subject-area liberal arts major. It also allows for considerable work in solo performance.

Bachelor of Arts in Music Ministry. This is an expansion of the former church music major. A new course will be added in hymnology and there will be more emphasis on applied conducting

Bachelor of Music in Music Education. This is our most ambitious undertaking, and we are praying for its readiness in the fall. In line with new state regulations, students in this program will concentrate either on a choral, instrumental, or general music track, all leading to state certification.

## MUSIC AT NORTHWEST COLLEGE

#### **NEW MUSIC COURSES COMING IN FALL 2000**

**MUSI 1033. Beginning Theory.** A course directed toward intended music majors who may not be ready for the freshman theory sequence, but are too advanced for Music Fundamentals. TR 8:30-9:50am. Fells.

MUSI 1213. Music of World Cultures. Part of the new music core, this course is designed to increase awareness of music outside the Euro-American tradition. This course is important for all students contemplating possible ministries among peoples of a culture different from their own. MWF 9:00-9:50am. Engle.

**APMU 1081.** Guitar Ensemble. A new music ensemble alternative for students who play acoustic guitar. The class will function as a *guitar band*, with each guitar playing separate parts in a variety of styles. M 3:30-4:45pm. Catford.

APMU 1111. Class Piano I. Open to both majors and non-majors, this course will start at the beginning, assuming no previous work in piano. It will meet in the college's anticipated piano lab, offering students the opportunity to learn piano without having to pay extra fees. It will also cover information previously assigned to the Piano Proficiency Test I. TR 12:30-1:20pm. Fells

**APMU 2111.** Class Piano II. A second-level continuation of Class Piano I. Open to students with piano background equivalent to Class Piano I. It will cover information previously assigned to the Piano Proficiency Test II. MW 12:30-1:20pm. Fells.

APMU 3182, MIDI. New to the music core, a course in music computer programs, including the production of music staff notation and related possibilities. TR 3:30-4:20PM. Owen.
