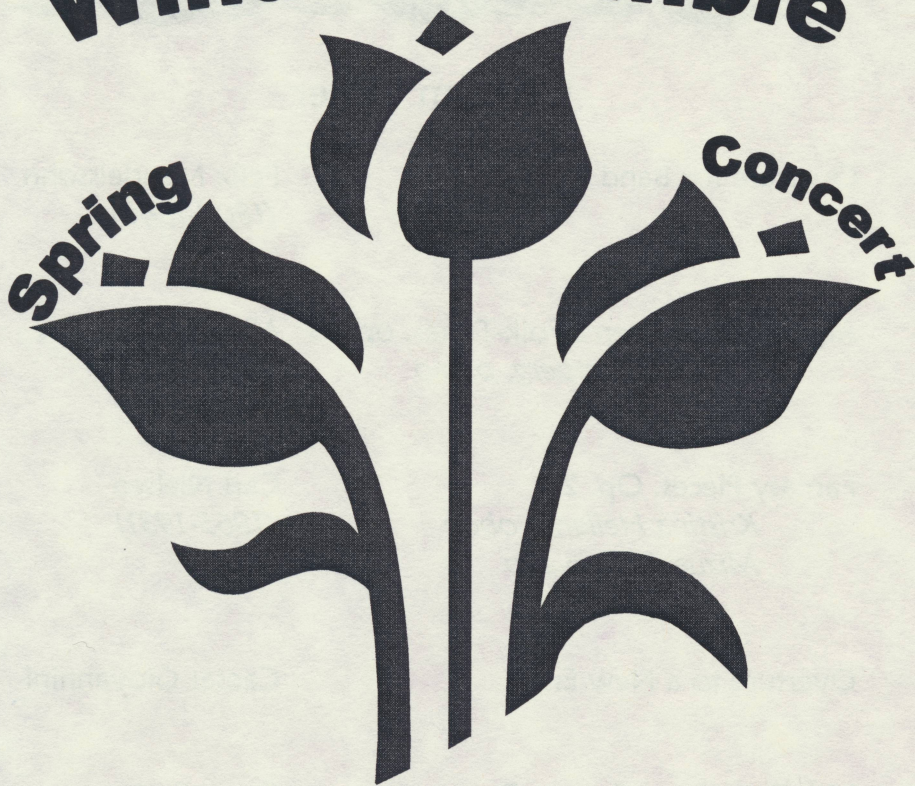

The Department

The music department offers six different ensembles and one does not have to be a music major to join. They are the Northwest Choralons, led by Brenda Rasmussen; chamber singers and concert choir, led by Bill Owen; wind ensemble, jazz band and vocal jazz, led by Ken Prettyman. Auditions for these groups are held during the first week of classes. All groups perform one major concert a semester and perform off campus as well.

The Northwest University Music Department offers four different degree programs in which the students may specialize in music, music education, music industry or music ministry. Students can also minor in music. The department has over 65 music majors and 21 music minors. There are four full time professors, three part time professors, ten adjuncts, one media director and one secretary. The department also offers private lessons to all students. Most types of lessons are available.

Recitals

The department has two more recitals to be held this year. *Our intermediate/advanced vocal recital will be held on Tuesday, April 11 and our advanced instrumental recital will be held on Tuesday, April 18.* Both start at 7:30 P.M. here in the chapel. Admission is FREE.

Our final concert for the year will be our spring concert choir and chamber choir concert to be held on Friday, April 28 at 7:30 P.M. here in the chapel. Tickets are \$7 adults and \$5 students/seniors. The choirs will also be at Bellevue Christian Reformed Church on April 30.
