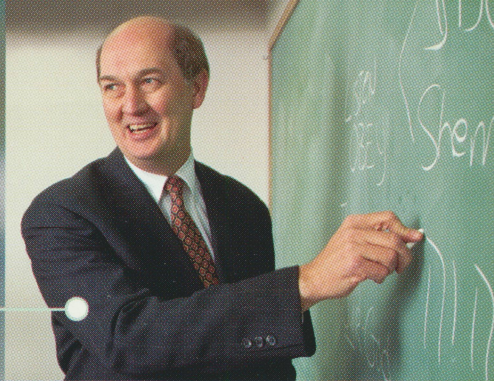
“What good is it for a man

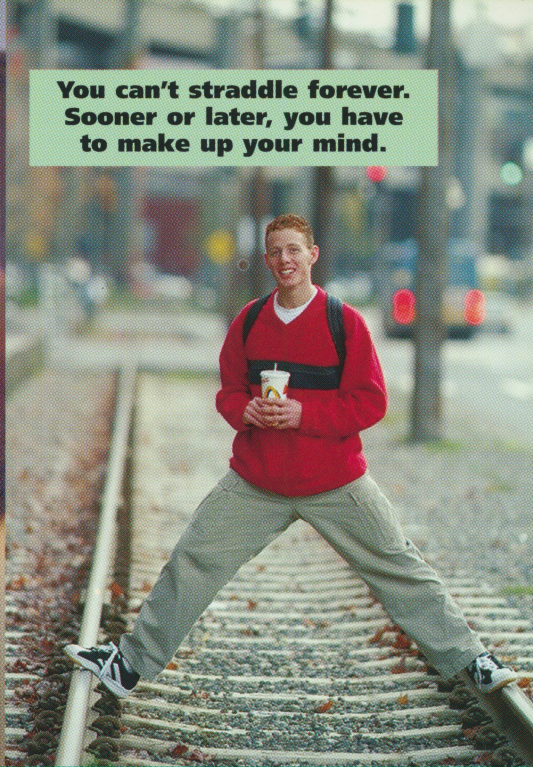

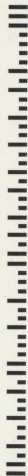

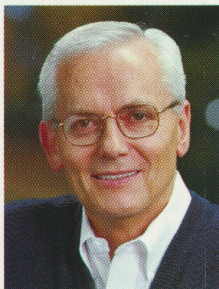
