

In addition to providing financial support, Act Six trains scholars on life skills such as intercultural communication and money management, and expects students to be a positive influence on campus. Liz is the captain of the soccer

team, while other scholars sing on the worship team or are resident advisers.

Liz is studying psychology and plans to attend grad school to

become a school counselor. Her dream job is to help students earn scholarships for college. "I want to go back to [West Seattle] and surrounding areas that aren't as affluent to do what I can," Liz said. "I have roots there."

Blessing Those Who Bless Lindsey Wessa

hen Lindsey Wessa studied abroad in Uganda, she discovered that concepts taught in her classes were applicable in the mission field. Her education in intercultural studies and Biblical studies equipped her to process and analyze situations quicker than other teammates who did not have a similar background.

Lindsey graduated from Northwest University in the spring of 2012 and now is volunteering for one year with a church planting movement in Uganda. She entered college without a vision for her life, but she had a heart for Africa. By the time she graduated, she felt convicted to do international work that served the Church.

Many College of Ministry graduates like Lindsey pursue full-time ministry opportunities that impact God's kingdom but hinder their ability to pay off school loans. Scholarships for these students help to relieve such burdens and enable them to focus on their ministries. Lindsey received scholarships through track and the College of Ministry, without which Northwest University would not have been an option.

Lindsey said. "He's changed my heart to believe it's worth investing in Him financially at Northwest. There's a greater return, and God won't leave you high and dry."

The Basics

Share of room and board for a student for one year \$100

Living on campus is an integral part of the Northwest University experience. As part of a residential community, students enjoy an environment that fosters life-long friendships, accountability, and spiritual engagement.

Room and board for a student for a semester

\$3,500

Your gift of room and board will bless a student with a home away from home in our residential community, which includes residence halls, upperclassmen apartments, and options for families, professionals, and graduate students.

Textbooks for a student \$600

Depending on each student's major and class load, the cost of textbooks can average \$600 or more. The expense can be a hardship for students with a full load of classes and additional financial needs.



Finding My Voice Chanara Green

Northwest University's gospel choir burst with talent, but the hearts of the performers make Choralons more than just a choir. Each concert is an opportunity to minister to the audience through testimonies and prayer. Choralons also partners with on-going ministries to engage in hands-on service, from performing in a juvenile detention center in Oregon to serving food to homeless people in downtown San Francisco.

Chanara Greene, one of the singers, contributed not only her voice, but also her story about a past struggle. At each concert, she shared how God restored her brokenness and changed her life. In Arizona, a girl in the audience with a similar story

tearfully confided in Chanara and asked for prayer.

"Being in Choralons has given me confidence and has enabled me to serve and pray for people," Chanara said. "When you talk to [the audience], you hear their struggles and you realize you're ministering to people God really cares about. This is a ministry that's healing to the body of Christ."

Over the course of rehearsing several times a week and traveling during tour season, the performers form a tight-knit community. "College could be scary," Chanara said, "but Choralons is a place where you feel refreshed, encouraged, get loved on, and give back. We're like a big family, and we can work as one for the Lord."

As someone who was queasy wearing a blood pressure cuff, Janell Peck never expected to become a nurse. Yet, her desire to serve others and be used for God's glory inevitably led her to Northwest University's nursing program. She graduated in 2010 and is a registered nurse in Seattle, with the goal of becoming a nursing educator.

Northwest University's nursing program is distinct in its focus on holistic care, which addresses spiritual and emotional needs in addition to physical care. For Janell, this means not only drawing blood

or managing pain, but also treating patients with Christ-like compassion and insight.

Nursing students are required to serve one month in another country—an experience that empowers graduates to impact the world through their profession. Through the trips, students' hearts are broken for people from different cultures and lifestyles. They also gain insight into healthcare around the world and develop cross-

cultural nursing skills.

"Language and culture may have separated me from these people, but the ability to provide

needed medical care bridged the gap," Janell said, recalling her experiences of delivering babies in Zimbabwe, teaching health education to pregnant women in Mexico, and holding the hands of AIDS patients in India. "It is exciting to have a tangible skill to bless others."


Outfit our nursing skills lab for a semester

Going Into All The World Chad Dickenson

In the rugged Ecuadorian village of Monte Sinai, where running water is scarce and a cement block house is a luxury, God used seven Northwest University students to share His love with local children and their families. Chad Dickenson was one of the seven who partnered with church planters in Monte Sinai to teach English in elementary schools as a way to build relationships between the church and schools.

The English lessons paved a way for the team to perform skits, share testimonies and the Gospel, and teach worship songs in the schools. Each day, dozens of neighborhood children surrounded the van when the group arrived. "They needed somebody who could show them they're valuable," Chad said. "One thing we can't just send on a FedEx truck is the gift of a hug or conversations."

By the end of the trip, one student felt God was calling her to

missions, specifically in Ecuador.
Other teammates were eager to return to Monte Sinai to continue the work they'd started.

Through the trip, Chad learned that walking in obedience to God means completely trusting Him. "He will bring the people and do the work," Chad

said. "Even in my ministry here in the U.S., getting volunteers is hard. But if you walk in obedience to what He's speaking to you, then you know He's going to make everything fall into place, whether it's how we thought it would be or something totally different."

n 2012, Northwest University is launching the Opportunity Fund to raise \$500,000 to expand vocational, spiritual, and academic opportunities for our students. While at Northwest University, students can volunteer with local ministries and lead their own outreaches.
